FOUNDATION GROWTH LEARNING



In Numeracy, students in the Foundation area have been engaging in a variety of lessons that have been focusing on recognising and matching numerals to written numbers up to 20. Students have been enjoying learning to also make the number using materials like counters, teddies and unifix blocks. As part of their measurement, the students are engaging in learning about the days of the week.



In term three we have been completing craft activities that correspond with shortlisted book week story-books. If I was a horse was a book that we read and then created a horse craft on. The students are also working very hard every morning on learning their letter sounds and blending and segmenting.



In inquiry, students are beginning their learning on celebrations around the world. This week we brainstormed all the things we knew about celebrations. 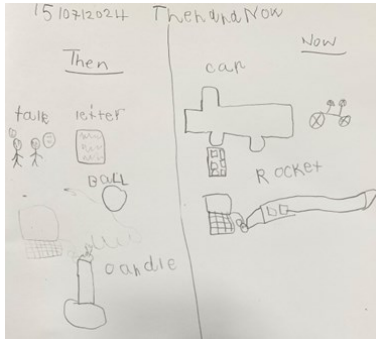

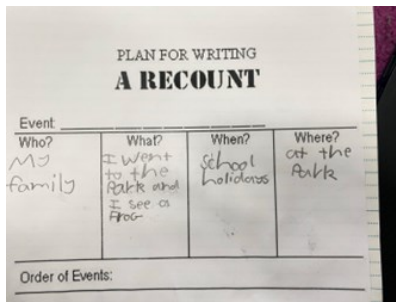

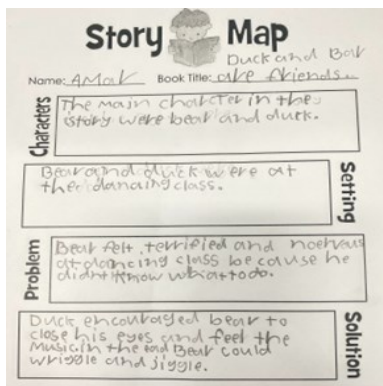
YEAR 1/2 GROWTH LEARNING



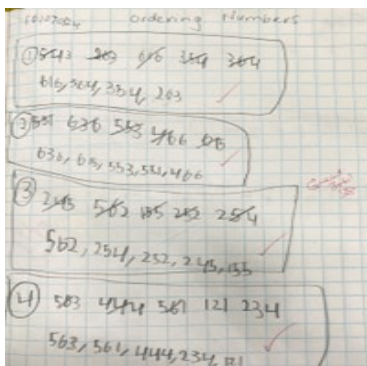
In term 3, our inquiry topic is 'then and now'. Students will be able to investigate and describe the differences and similarities between life in the past and life today, focusing on various aspects such as technology, transportation, communication, and daily routines. Students are exposed with visuals and videos illustrating life in the past and present to spark curiosity. They have created a class chart (KWI) brainstorm what



Students will develop the ability to write a recount of a personal experience or event. They will practice constructing simple sentences that clearly convey key details, such as who was involved, what happened, where it took place, and when it occurred. This will help them build their narrative skills and ability to communicate effectively.



In Reading, students are learning to unpack the and identify the key elements of a story (characters, setting, beginning, middle and end). Students used story maps to visually organize and re-tell stories, enhance reading comprehension through visual representation and sequencing events.



In our math class, students reviewed their skills on recognizing place values and ordering numbers using visual aids (place value charts, uni-fix, MAB blocks). Students were exposed to interactive games and worksheets focusing on identifying the place values, group activities were also implemented where students use number cards and dices to create numbers and discuss, compare, and order from largest to smallest.

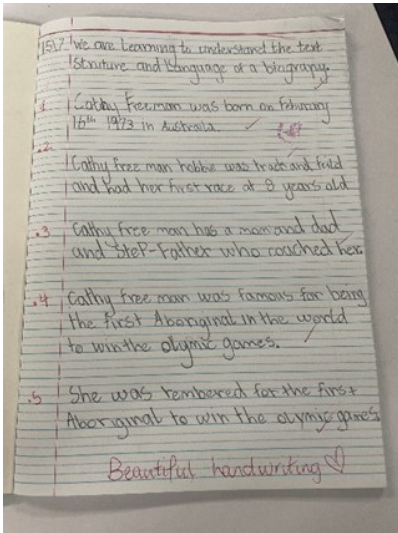

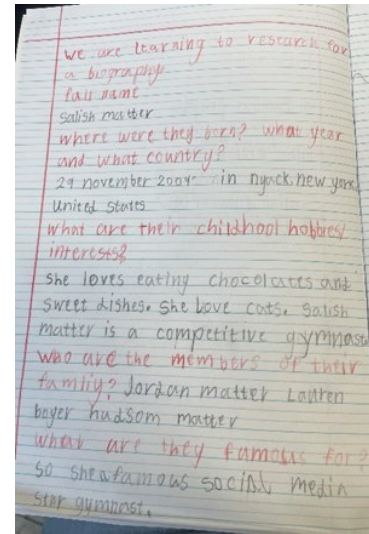

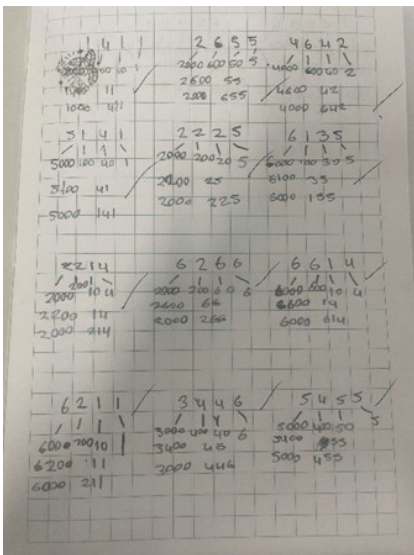
YEAR 3/4 GROWTH LEARNING

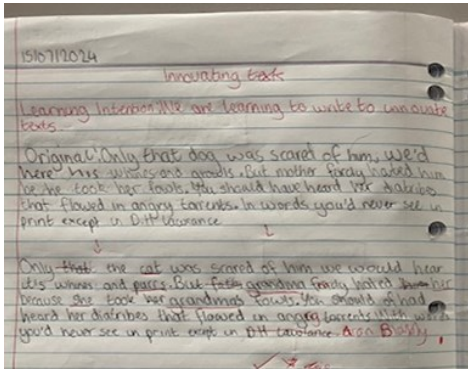

YEAR 5/6 GROWTH LEARNING

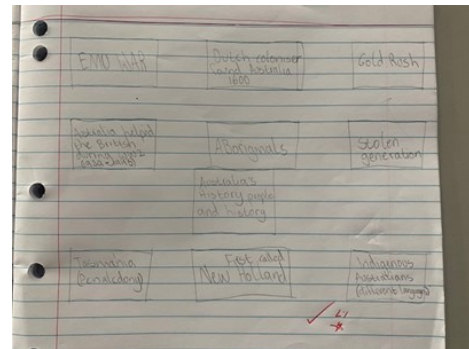


The first topic for writing this term is poetry. Linking to our Inquiry topic, students are looking at famous Australian poets. This week we looked at Kath Walker, a famous Indigenous poet. With a focus on innovation, students unpacked the poem, discussed the theme, and began to make changes to the poem without altering the core meaning. This is an important skill to develop as it allows for students to enhance their ability to generate creative ideas

Our reading topic connects to our writing topic, where students are looking at the same poem 'Ballad of Totems' by Kath Walker. Students researched Kath Walker's impact on Australian history. They also studied her poem and explored the rhyming structure used. Additionally, students are improving their vocabulary by being exposed to the intricate language within the poems, as they find synonyms for words that are unfamiliar.

The students are revisiting place value with an emphasis on decimals. They are learning how to identify, compare and order decimals from smallest to greatest. Additionally, students are expanding their mathematical vocabulary as they look at whole numbers and fractional parts, including tenths and hundredths. Furthermore, we are looking at measurement, more specifically, length. Students are learning to convert measurements of length using the conversion table.



It has been an exciting start to the term, kicking off our new inquiry topic 'Australia; Fast Forward and Rewind'. Students discussed their prior knowledge of Australia, its history, government, and First Nation People. We then tuned in and broadened our knowledge to determine specific areas that we'd like to research, create, and action. We're looking forward to seeing the students' interest grow and which path they go down, whether it be government, history or First Nation People.
